Havana is the capital city, largest city, province, major port, and leading commercial centre of Cuba.

Trinidad was named a UNESCO world heritage site in 1988 and is a perfectly preserved Spanish colonial settlement. It was built on huge sugar fortunes amassed in the adjacent Valle de los Ingenios during the early 19th century,

The port city of **Cienfuegos** was founded in 1819 and is one of Cuba's newest settlements, but also one of its most architecturally interesting, a factor that earned it a Unesco World Heritage Site listing in 2005
